Under his guidance, the LearnGeeta App was born in 2023 not as a flashy product, but as a clean, purposeful, and spiritually resonant tool. Initially offering access to helplines and recorded Vivechans, the app was intentionally minimal, its simplicity echoing the clarity of the Gita itself.

But as sadhaks engaged, so did evolution. Feedback flowed in, and the app responded like a living organism. Soon, one could join Zoom classes directly from the app, no searching for links, no confusion. The LearnGeeta Saral Pathaneeya books could be ordered with a few taps. Volunteers could access Prachar materials, register family members, and even join WhatsApp groups – all from one sacred hub.

The app's second wave of development brought integrated links for exam practice, connections to the Ram Pratishtha app, and much more. It was no longer just a utility; it had become a spiritual companion. As one sadhak aptly put it: "It feels like carrying the entire LearnGeeta program in my pocket."

Today, the IT team continues its quiet innovation, developing features like daily Shloka updates, reminders, and interactive learning tools. Guided not just by tech trends but by tapasya, their mission is clear: to merge

technology with transcendence and serve the Gita in the language of the times.
